One of the UK's most notable psychological therapists and crime commentators, Emma Kenny is here to give us an education in what creates a serial killer, and where they may be hiding in plain sight...

Kenny takes us on a journey, looking at what ingredients lead to body counts like those of Ted Bundy or Jeffrey Dahmer, and could anything have prevented their potential being activated? This live talk is a collision of pop culture intrigue and cold, hard facts, with a dash of gallows humour which takes the difficult material away from being too tough to handle. Learn to better understand the psychology of a murderous mind here in Worthing on Wednesday 24 November, 7:30pm.

The show will be centered on Kenny's research and the central facts of a variety of cases, but will also focus on the idea that anyone we know could have the potential to be a serial killer and what can we do to recognise the signs. In conversation with *The Courier*, she says *'serial killers live amongst us, move between us, are even married to us, and only by studying their behaviour can we adapt ours to give us a fighting chance of survival should they sliver into our lives.'*

While she specialises in victimology, Kenny is mostly known in the media for presenting crime shows including *Britain's Darkest Taboos*, *Lady Killers*, and *The Killer in My Family*. Indeed, she has presented over 70 crime shows analysing cases both in the UK and the States, exploring why some people can be born into seemingly *'normal'* environments yet still choose a murderous path.

Utilising her honed skills as a psychotherapist, Kenny provides expert opinion on many radio stations, including BBC Radio, Heart and Magic, and regularly contributes to publications including *Grazia* and *Cosmopolitan*. She is also the founder of *Appy* - a health and wellbeing social media app.

Kenny worked rehabilitating young offenders for over a decade and found that her interest in true crime is not led by gratuitous voyeurism, rather a natural empathy. She says, *'people who love true crime tend to have higher empathy levels - this real connection with wanting to understand what it is that makes another human being do something that to them is just beyond reprehensible.'* It is for this reason she wasn't surprised that 70% of her audience are women who love true crime.
